

## **Distinguished Service Award (DSA)**

The DSA recognizes members and staff for their extended (lifetime) contributions and service to SCR.

While the DSA is intended to recognize high quality service to the Association on a long-term basis, it should not necessarily be viewed as an "end-of-career" or "lifetime" award. Each recipient shall have demonstrated a high level of commitment to SCR. He or she shall have contributed a substantial amount of time, effort, and creative imagination to the Association and shall have established a record of effective participation in the affairs of the Association. The recipient's Association activities shall have set a high standard and shall have been worthy of emulation.

- Nominees must be members in good standing or an employee of SCR or a local association.
- Nominees must be nominated by SCR or their local association along with the required SCR application form.
- The nominee(s) must have a minimum of ten years of outstanding service and contribution to SCR in areas such as committee leadership, state directorship, and business accomplishments.
- Award recipients will receive the following additional recognition
  - A special, custom designed plaque
  - Free entry into all SCR ticketed events for the following year for themselves and a quest
  - o Recognition of the Award through SCR's social media and member communications.
